

## Endless Landscape or Myriorama

This toy, called a Myriorama in the nineteenth century, was a set of cards with a landscape drawn on the cards. The horizon matched on each card so that they could be changed in any number of combinations.

The following quote was found in the September 1870 issue of *The Riverside Magazine for Young People*. “. . . you had been allowed to play with certain picture-cards, that were never taken out of the parlor. . . It was called their Myriorama, or something like that. . . They are long pictured cards of the Rhine, or some river; and we had them rowed out on the floor, and played it was the Rhine itself.” Although the previous quote is from 1870, the set of cards we sell is a reproduction of one published in Leipzig, Germany in 1830.
